2. Presentation and Performance:

Ensembles are required to perform three selections at their class level as follows:

- **MANDATORY: ONE SELECTION FROM THE FESTIVAL SYLLABUS**
- Two (2) selections in contrasting style (may be individual movements from a single work) - director's choice

NOTE: It is strongly recommended that one of the three pieces be lyrical in nature.

The selection of repertoire, suitability of repertoire for the ensemble, and level and style of repertoire will be considered in the final rating. "Pop" music is not considered appropriate for festival performance.

Each ensemble director is responsible for providing the Adjudicators with two (2) ORIGINAL conductor's scores of each selection that is to be performed. The scores must be presented to the Adjudicators' Secretary prior to commencement of the class.

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2. Presentation and Performance (cont'd)

Set-up and Performance Time:

Time Limits, including set-up, tuning and performance, will be as follows:

Band Classes B100 and 200	20 minutes
Band Classes B300, 400, 500 and 600	30 minutes
Jazz Classes A601 and A701	20 minutes
Jazz Classes A301, 401 and 501	30 minutes
Jazz Combo / School Orchestra	20 minutes

- Performance time will include any time required for seating arrangements and tuning of the ensemble. The clock will begin as soon as the first band member steps on stage. Any ensemble exceeding its time allotment will forfeit time from their clinic.
- Each performing ensemble will receive a clinic with a Festival Clinician focusing on observations made during the performance.

NOTE: PHOTOCOPYING OF COPYRIGHT MATERIAL IS ILLEGAL; THE FESTIVAL COMMITTEE CANNOT ACCEPT PHOTOCOPIED SCORES FOR ADJUDICATION.

3. Adjudication:

- All Adjudicator's comments will be intended as a guide for the continued development of the ensemble.
- All ensembles perform to the standard as determined by the adjudication guidelines. Adjudications will include consideration of stylistic interpretation, intonation, dynamics, attacks, releases, balance, repertoire, etc.
- Written and recorded adjudications will be available as soon as possible following the completion of the performance.

4. Equipment:

- Due to equipment limitations, not all equipment will be available in the warm-up room Thank You for your understanding and cooperation.
- The following equipment will be provided in the performance area and clinic room: Concert Band: chairs, music stands, bass amp, snare drum, bass drum, 4 timpani, xylophone and chimes.

Jazz Band: chairs, music stands, microphones and full rhythm section including acoustic piano, drums, vibes, guitar amp and bass amp, keyboard amp and synthesizer stand (bring your own synthesizer and all patch cords). All other equipment must be provided by participating ensembles.

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4. Equipment: (cont'd)

- The Festival will not provide cymbals, mallets, beaters, sticks,

auxiliary percussion or other equipment not listed in (b) above.

5. Standards of Performance:

Gold, Silver, Bronze and Participation will be used.

- i). A Gold Standard signifies that an ensemble has achieved excellence in all facets of its performance.
- ii). A Silver Standard signifies that an ensemble is demonstrating an exceedingly high standard of performance.
- iii). A Bronze Standard signifies an above average quality of performance.
- iv). A Participation signifies an average quality of performance with many areas open for improvement.

6. Listening:

Music teachers are asked to ensure adequate supervision of students at all times. Unruly deportment reflects poorly on us all. Students should be encouraged to listen to other groups with a supportive attitude. Please discuss etiquette with your students. Thank you for your cooperation.

CHORAL RULES

1. In class choirs at least 75% of the class must participate.
2. School choirs may be competitive or non-competitive. Please mark on Entry Form.
3. Classes 3113 to 3115 can be sung either in harmony or unison, and music may be transposed to suit the range of the choir.
4. All classes perform 2 or 3 selections that contrast in style and mood.
5. One (1) ORIGINAL copy of the music selections MUST be received by the Festival Registrar by February 6th in order to mail to the adjudicator for perusal.
6. Title and composer of each selection must be announced clearly by the conductor before each piece is performed.
7. ADJUDICATION: see Band Division, page 35, Rule #3.
8. STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE & LISTENING: see Band Division, page 36, Rule #5 and Rule #6.

Each competitor must supply the Adjudicator with a copy of the piece to be played. No Photocopies are allowed for the student, Adjudicator or accompanist. Please use original scores only. (Tablature and chord symbols are acceptable in this division.)
- If time limit will allow, 2 contrasting pieces may be played.
- OWN COMPOSITION** For solo instrument, vocal, instruments with piano accompaniment or any combination of chamber instruments.
*A copy of the composition MUST be received by the Festival Registrar by February 1st in order to mail to the adjudicator for perusal. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** More than one entry per contestant is allowed as long as they represent different disciplines.*

STRING RULES

- Participants must choose to play in ONE DIVISION ONLY, (i.e. Primary, Junior, etc.) Please note Rule 11 under "General Rules For Festival Entry". Additional entries may be chosen from the Ensemble Class.
See Page 20, Rule 11 for exception in String Division Only.
- Unless otherwise stated, one piece per class is required. Own choice. Grade levels should be based on any Current Recognized School of Music Syllabus and this should also be used as a guide (R.C.M.; Victoria Conservatory of Music; Conservatory Canada). When a conflict occurs, the Royal Conservatory of Music Examinations Syllabus (2013) will take precedence.
- No Class winner is eligible to enter final play-offs or win an award with a mark less than 86. To be recommended to the Provincial Competitions, the competitor must achieve a mark of 85 or over.
- In order to be eligible to win Primary, Junior, Intermediate or Senior Trophies a contestant must have performed in at least two (2) solo classes within a given Division, one (1) of which may be a Concert Group Class.
- Repeat signs are to be used only if they form an integral part of the Composition (i.e. Da capo, Dal Segno, etc.). However, repeats in repertoire from the Violin series (R.C.M.) should be observed if they are so indicated in the footnote below the music.
- Own selection must be played within the time limits given.
- ARCT Classes: Limit 3 years and Open Classes ARCT beyond 3 years or Licentiate.
- Own selection numbers must not be repeated by the same competitor in successive years.
- A Concerto must not be used as an "Own Selection" in any solo class except Concerto Class or Concert Class.
- An original unmarked copy of the music must be provided to the Adjudicator. Please number the first measure of each line in the score.
- Competitors entering Primary, Junior, Intermediate and Senior String Division Classes, Grades 1 - 10 may substitute one piece in the next higher grade if it is in the SAME Division or in Concert Class Only one piece may cross into the next Division.

STRING RULES (cont'd)

- Contestants are not eligible to play in the same grade or lower grade in the Festival than the grade previously passed in the Royal Conservatory or equivalent examination with the exception of current or Winter exams. This applies to Junior, Intermediate and Senior Classes.

1. No class winner is eligible to enter final competition with a mark less than 86. To be recommended, by the Adjudicator, to the Provincial competitions, a competitor must achieve a mark of 85 or over. In order to be considered for BC Provincials, a competitor must compete in at least two (2) solo classes within a given Grade Division.
2. Championships may be withheld if no performance measures up to the championship caliber in the Adjudicator's opinion.
3. A student may enter any class on a competitive or non-competitive basis. Non-competitive students will receive a written adjudication only, and they will not be considered for placement or awards. All fee structures and regulations apply. **Please mark on Entry Form if non-competitive.**
4. In Ensemble Classes Only: If time limit will allow, 2 contrasting pieces may be played.
5. RCM 2003 Brass Syllabus, RCM 2005 Percussion Syllabus, RCM 2006 / 2010 / 2014 Woodwind Syllabus and RCM 2008 Recorder Syllabus are to be used as a Guide to appropriately Graded Music Selections for all instruments.
6. Participants may not compete in more than one division. A participant may not enter more than four (4) solo classes in a division.
